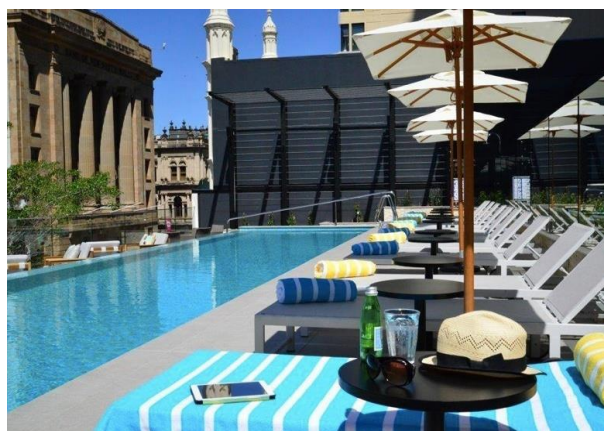

PORT DOUGLAS



Mossman Gorge

Just a short drive from the small town of Mossman lays a picturesque oasis of lush rainforest and trickling streams; one with a 2.5-kilometre hiking track filled with scenic outlooks and a small but stunning gorge where visitors can be found taking a refreshing swim in the clear, cool waters. The sounds of the nearby waterfall crashing into the sandy shore below make for a magical setting, one that entices hikers and nature lovers on their exploration and discovery of this slice of the Daintree National Park.

Just minutes from Mossman, the narrow country lane of Mossman Gorge Road leads to the modern and impressive visitors centre for the Mossman Gorge area of the Daintree National Park. Browse through the attractive gift shop and small information centre and enjoy some refreshments before taking a shuttle to the beginning of the park's hiking trail. Just a short way down the hiking trail visitors come to the stunning gorge where people are often found enjoying a swim or sitting on the giant rocks in the stream. Continue past the gorge where beautiful rainforest scenery mix with the calls of native birds and beautiful plant life. A fascinating suspension bridge offers a rustic, utilitarian way to cross the creek with lovely views of the waterfall cascading down to the gorge.

From Cairns or Port Douglas, take the Captain Cook Highway to Mossman. Just before entering the town, make a left turn from Captain Cook Highway on to Johnston Road. The road is just past the local Woolworths and Town and Country Shopping Centre. Follow signs to Mossman Gorge Centre which will be on the right hand side. A large car park is available with plenty of free parking.

Jungle Surfing

Have you ever dreamed of being a bird, flying through the rainforest with a sky-high view of the lush beauty and incredible scenery for as far as the eye can see? Well if flying above the trees is something that tickles your fancy then consider a jungle surfing excursion through the Daintree Rainforest. There's no more fun or adventurous way to see the natural Daintree beauty than with a zip-line flight over the trees.

This is definitely the most interesting tour you can take through the rainforest, flying from treetop platform to platform on thrilling zip-lines that are up to 22 metres above the ground. With your birds'-eye-view you'll catch excellent views of not only the dense rainforest below but of streams and valleys and even the ocean in the far distance. These thrilling tours are recognised for their eco-friendly practices and the guided forest trips are suitable for all ages. Jungle surfers are free to hang up-side down and fly as fast as they can go on the 25 to 78-metre long expanses, or guides can control your speed for a leisurely ride over the forest canopy - it's all up to you.

Jungle Surfing Canopy Tours is located in Cape Tribulation about 2.5 hours north of Cairns or 25-kilometres north of Mossman. Private vehicles are not allowed on the tour company's property due to the one lane road however shuttle service is available from Cape Tribulation accommodation sites. The meeting point for those driving themselves is at Snake House, Lot 2 on Cape Tribulation Road. Pick up time from this meeting point is set at time of booking.

Great Barrier Reef Day Trips

With crystal-clear waters and colourful tropical marine life, Queensland's Great Barrier Reef is a dream destination. The burgeoning resort town of Port Douglas in tropical North Queensland is ideally positioned on the doorstep of the Great Barrier Reef for day trips to explore the pristine underwater wonderland of this UNESCO World Heritage site.

The Great Barrier Reef is the world's largest living organism and coral reef system stretching over 2,600km in the Coral Sea. The must-visit attraction is home to myriad marine and plant life from whales, dolphins, turtles, dugongs and porpoises to 500 different species of microscopic algae and seaweed as well as water birds.

Over 1,500 tropical fish species including clownfish, snapper, coral trout, rays and sharks reside among colourful hard and soft corals, molluscs and seahorses. This bountiful aquatic reserve offers amazing sights and unique experiences for swimmers, snorkellers, divers and boating enthusiasts.

Say hello to a stingray or float among the fishes

Several local operators offer over 100 tours and day trips to discover the Great Barrier Reef from Port Douglas. There are many ways to explore the reef including cruises, snorkelling and diving trips, fishing adventures, and leisurely swimming and sightseeing opportunities. Popular destinations include diving and snorkelling around the outer reefs to spy and swim with the colourful aquatic life, and visiting one of the Great Barrier Reef's 880 islands and 300 reefs or cays by luxury boat.

Sightseers can watch the multi-hued marine population through a glass-bottomed boat, or park themselves on a beach or catamaran with a champagne lunch and enjoy the views. There are also whale-watching cruises during the humpback migration season, and fly or hot air balloon and cruise tour options.

The duration and cost of individual tours vary but also attract an AU\$5.50 reef tax per person. Tours depart daily from the nautical gateway to Great Barrier Reef – the Port Douglas Marina at Marina Mirage - with transfers usually included or can be arranged from Port Douglas accommodations.

Australian Butterfly Sanctuary

Dazzle your retinas with the sight of more than 1,500 multicoloured tropical butterflies in Australia's largest butterfly flight aviary and exhibit. Located around 68km south of Port Douglas and 30 minutes' drive north of Cairns, Australian Butterfly Sanctuary has been delighting visitors with special encounters with the delicate and multi-hued winged creatures since 1987.

Situated in tropical North Queensland, where the majority of Australia's butterflies and moths reside, the sanctuary houses their specimens in their preferred lush, natural rainforest canopy habitat complete with favoured food plants, waterfalls and a running stream. The eggs are carefully collected by staff and over 30,000 caterpillars are hand-reared in the dedicated laboratory or caterpillar breeding nursery before around 24,000 pupae are released back into the flight aviary yearly. This intensive handling means the butterflies are used to interacting with people and frequently land on visitors within the aviary. Some of the species you can spy on your visit include the huge Hercules moth, jewel butterflies, lacewings, azures, triangles, Emperor moths, the stunning blue Ulysses butterfly and Australia's largest butterfly - the green-and-gold Cairns Birdwing.

Admission to Australian Butterfly Sanctuary is AU\$19 for adults and AU\$9.50 for children aged four to 14 years. Entry includes a free half-hour guided tour of the butterfly aviary and a Behind-the-Scenes Laboratory Tour. Tours run daily from 10am to 3.15pm and offer the opportunity to glean plenty of interesting facts about these intriguing and beautiful creatures, as well as gain an insight into the various stages of butterfly and moth development to ensure you'll see your garden in a whole different light.

To get to Australian Butterfly Sanctuary from Port Douglas, take the Captain Cook Highway/State Route 44 through four roundabouts then take the third exit onto Kennedy Highway/National Route 1. After 14km, turn left onto Rob Veivers Drive to the destination - around one hour's drive.

Daintree Rainforest

Home of the world's oldest rainforest, tropical North Queensland's Daintree National Park is a living remnant of prehistoric times with rare flora and fauna found nowhere else on the planet. The stunningly beautiful coastal lowland rainforest covers an area of around 8,900 hectares and is situated in the Wet Tropics UNESCO World Heritage site around 45km drive south of Port Douglas.

The biodiverse lush environment of the Daintree traverses eucalypt woodlands, swamps and mangroves and tropical rainforest canopies and a plethora of indigenous fauna. You can spy rare tree kangaroos, endangered quolls, and the Daintree River ring-tailed possum, which is only found around Thornton Peak and the upper areas of the Mossman and Daintree Rivers. Elsewhere you might see some of the hundreds of bird species that reside in the Daintree including the flightless southern cassowary, colourful kingfishers, scrubtails, bowerbirds and much more. The Daintree is also the traditional land of the Eastern Kuku Yalanji Aboriginal tribe and contains several sacred sites including Thornton Peak, Mount Demi, The Bluff and Cape Tribulation. Indigenous-led guided tours can enlighten visitors about the medicinal plants and bush tucker, culture, history and folklore of the area.

For the most pleasant experience in the tropics, the best time to visit the Daintree is the dry season (May to October) however the wet season, from November to April, is also beautiful with lush flowering vegetation. The north and south banks of the Daintree River are linked by the Daintree Ferry - the only cable ferry in tropical Australia, and the best way to get around the area is by car or you can also hire bicycles.

To visit the Daintree from Port Douglas (a one-hour drive), follow the Captain Cook Highway/State Route 44 onto Mossman-Daintree Road. Turn right onto Cape Tribulation Road and take the Daintree Ferry to cross the Daintree River to Forest Creek - AU\$23 for cars for a return trip. Continue straight to stay on Cape Tribulation Road.

Four Mile Beach

The main beach of Port Douglas is a perfectly soft, sandy stretch spanning from the northern headland and gently curving around for uninterrupted views into the horizon with accommodation and housing neatly hidden behind swaying palm trees. Just a five-minute walk from the main area of Port Douglas, Four Mile Beach is an idyllic tropical locale.

This popular tourist destination is one of the best-known beaches in northern Queensland. Four Mile Beach has its origins at the bottom of the 70m-high Island Point, a rocky headland to the north, and ends at the rocks, reefs and mangroves of the Mowbray River mouth. The northern end is located just 1km from the town centre of Port Douglas and is the most accessible and popular entry point. This is also where the Port Douglas Surf Lifesaving Club (SLSC) patrols the beach and maintains an enclosure net during stinger (jellyfish) season. Further down the beach is the Mirage Resort with three beach access paths and a residential area and sailing club to the south.

The beach is predominantly low and flat with water conditions favouring low, short waves that are better suited for kite and wind surfing than board surfing, especially when the Trade Winds blow from the south during the winter months. Rips are rare, but it's best to swim within the patrolled area. The appeal of Four Mile Beach really lies in its pristine wilderness and unspoilt beauty. The stunning sandy stretch is juxtaposed against tropical rainforest for idyllic sunrise and sunset vistas and shade during the day. Beach amenities include picnic and barbecue facilities, a playground and restroom and shower areas.

To visit Four Mile Beach, it's a 1km and 13-minute walk from the town centre of Port Douglas. Walk down Macrossan Street towards Davidson Street, turn right onto Garrick Street (where the SLSC is), then left onto Beryl Street and continue onto Sand Street for the northern end of Four Mile Beach.

Port Douglas offers a wide variety of shopping options sure to suit every taste, style, and budget.

From high-end women's and men's fashion boutiques, trendy surf shops, exquisite jewellery, souvenirs, and unique furniture something is bound to catch your eye.

The shopping in Port Douglas is second to none so make sure you leave some time in between exploring the reef and rainforest to browse through shops along the trendy Macrossan Street, the popular Marina Mirage, or the fun [Port Douglas Sunday Markets](#).

If you're making a visit or staying in hotel accommodation in Port Douglas, be sure to drop by the markets. It's located in a grassy park, right on the waterfront overlooking the Coral Sea. Vendors come from all over the Far North to sell their products to inquisitive tourists and Port Douglas locals. Here you'll find arts and crafts, jewellery, fruit and vegetables, glassware, books, coffee, boats, and more. For locals and tourists alike the Sunday Morning extravaganza in Market Park is well worth getting out of your hotel bed for. The lazy Sunday morning is actually promoted here, in the idyllic setting of shady palm trees and warm, caressing ocean breezes blowing in from the sparkling ocean. You could be dreaming...

There is a definite carnival feel to the Port Douglas Markets. Perhaps it's the cheery stallholders, keen to have a chat, or perhaps it's the dazzling blue ocean backdrop. The vivid array of arts, innovative crafts, clothing and exotic fruits seems so much brighter and appealing than your average market fare - they almost shout for your attention as you wander by.

Children run and play between the market stalls, local musicians busk and the scent of freshly picked flowers and ripe exotic fruit intermingles with the pure sea air. The Port Douglas Market stalls literally back onto the golden shores of Port Douglas beach, and the soft sands provide the perfect location to sit and be; to soak in the vibrant ambiance and breathtaking views. Visitors quickly realise there is more to Port Douglas Markets than just goods for sale. This is a lively public domain where people share ideas and company, where diversity reigns supreme; a true melting pot of people.

The Port Douglas Markets were established 20 years ago when the council decreed it a 'Cotter's Market' which ensured that all goods offered would be made or produced by the stallholder or their immediate family. This ruling has proved its worth because in today's global economy the Port Douglas Markets are somewhere where you can still find genuine 'local' businesses offering unique goods and services and all made by hand. Here else can you find screen printed beach towels, colourful baby swings, classy cotton apparel and artistically hand crafted jewellery. For special gifts, the crafted local wood products make a genuine souvenir and the innovative 'flotsam and jetsam' stall sells recycled timbers fashioned into fantastic yet useful home goods. There are leather goods, all hand made, and even custom fitted sandals. Paintings, postcards and aboriginal artworks are all well priced and it's difficult to resist the glorious tropical colours of the beachwear.

As you browse you could try some of the exotic tropical fruits for sale, or some home made peanut brittle. Discover the carefully carved coconut faces, each displaying intriguing personalities and unique adornments. When your basket is full or your senses sated you can beat a retreat to the iconic Court House Hotel, just across the road, where the music will continue into the afternoon and where you can always find something sumptuous to eat.

If your inclinations lie in other directions, then within your view is the quaint little wooden church of St. Mary's by the Sea. It can accommodate a small congregation, a few interested visitors or a [Wedding](#) in Paradise. It certainly must have one of the best vistas you can imagine. Otherwise, wander through the quaint seaside village of Port Douglas and enjoy the many bookstores, cafes, art galleries and boutique shops.



Port Douglas Macrossan St Shops

Located just a few blocks from Four Mile Beach, Macrossan Street is the main street in Port Douglas and is quite the shopping and dining hub. The street buzzes with activity every day of the week, with trendy fashionistas browsing racks of funky clothes and stopping along the way for a much needed lunch break of coffee.

Macrossan Street boasts plenty of women's and men's fashion boutiques, jewellery, furniture, and many souvenir stores where you are bound to find the perfect memento of your time in the tropical seaside town. Macrossan Street is also home to locally run art stores. These stores sell original Aboriginal art and cultural artifacts such as stunning Dreamtime paintings, hand painted didgeridoos and boomerangs, as well as plenty of contemporary hand crafted pieces. A piece of Aboriginal art is something to be treasured as each item is handmade and tells a story. Most Aboriginal artwork comes with an explanation of the artist's inspiration and story, and the work that goes into each piece will surely amaze you.

Along Macrossan Street you will find Port Village Shopping Center which is home to a few of the staples. The center has a Coles grocery store, medical center, pharmacy, as well as clothing boutiques including Jay Jays and Just Jeans. Macrossan Street also offers great value accommodation in self catering style apartments if you would like to be just upstairs from all of the shopping and lunching action. One thing is for certain, if you are in need of a new swimsuit, Macrossan Street will have the right one for you. Home to plenty of surf and swimwear shops, there are hundreds of swimming costume options for the most conservative water baby to those who want to get pretty close to having an all over tan.

Lone Pine Koala Sanctuary

It is impossible to go past the undeniably cute faces of koalas – tiny black noses, fluffy grey ears and an unquenchable lust for eucalypt leaves makes them Australia's most iconic animal. Lone Pine Koala Sanctuary is the best place to get up close and personal with a koala, as well as an array of other native Australian animals.

If it is cuddles with a koala that you are after, Lone Pine Koala Sanctuary is the place to go. A short bus ride from the centre of Brisbane, nestled in natural bushland, is Lone Pine Koala Sanctuary, the first and largest koala sanctuary in the world. Over 130 koalas call Lone Pine home, as does an abundance of other native Australian animals – there's plenty of kangaroos, possums, Tasmanian Devils, echidnas, dingoes, emus and cassowaries to keep visitors entertained. Established in 1927, the sanctuary is at the forefront of koala conservation and education.



The highlight of any visit to Lone Pine is the chance to take a photo holding a koala, but there's much more on offer. Over 130 kangaroos and wallabies that roam freely around a large enclosure are happy to pose for photos, and the local flock of rainbow lorikeets enjoy being hand fed. If you're up for something scalier, a snake or baby crocodile can also be cuddled – or held at a distance, if that's a bit easier to handle – and there's the opportunity for photos with owls and wedge-tailed eagles. Handlers frequently run interactive demonstrations and shows to teach visitors about the wildlife they are handling.

Lone Pine is a 35-minute bus ride south of the centre of Brisbane, but the best way to get there is by boat – Mirimar II cruises depart from the Cultural Centre pontoon at 10am daily, returning to the city at 1.45pm. Mirimar takes a little over an hour to cruise down the Brisbane River to Lone Pine, giving visitors the chance to lay back, soak up the sun on the deck and watch the stunning riverside scenery fly past.

Watch the world-famous Wildlife Warriors show at noon, with all the slithering, swooping, jaw-snapping action of saltwater crocodiles, birds and snakes LIVE in the Crocoseum. And don't forget to stop by the Australia Zoo Wildlife Hospital – the largest and busiest facility of its kind in the Australia – where you can watch vets saving endangered Australian animals.

Australia Zoo also provides a variety of animal encounters and tours, allowing guests the opportunity to learn all there is to know about the Zoo and all the wonderful animals. Explore behind the scenes and go where few visitors have gone before with the Platinum Zoo Adventure, which includes a personal tour guide and photographer to ensure an unforgettable day out!
