2014 Itinerary

Day One: Sat 21 June, Kununurra

Arrive Kununurra, transfer to your accommodation at Pinctada Kimberley Grande.

Kununurra aptly named 'meeting of big waters' is located on the banks of the Ord River. First gazetted in the 1960s as the centre for the Ord River Irrigation Scheme; today Kununurra is a hub of local industry for agriculture, mining and a host of holiday experiences.

Depart Kununurra for Purnululu National Park

The striped beehive domes, of the Bungle Bungle range are one of the World's most fascinating geological landmarks, rising up to 300 metres.

Wander among the Bungle Bungle range including Cathedral Gorge a natural amphitheatre where you'll stop for a picnic lunch

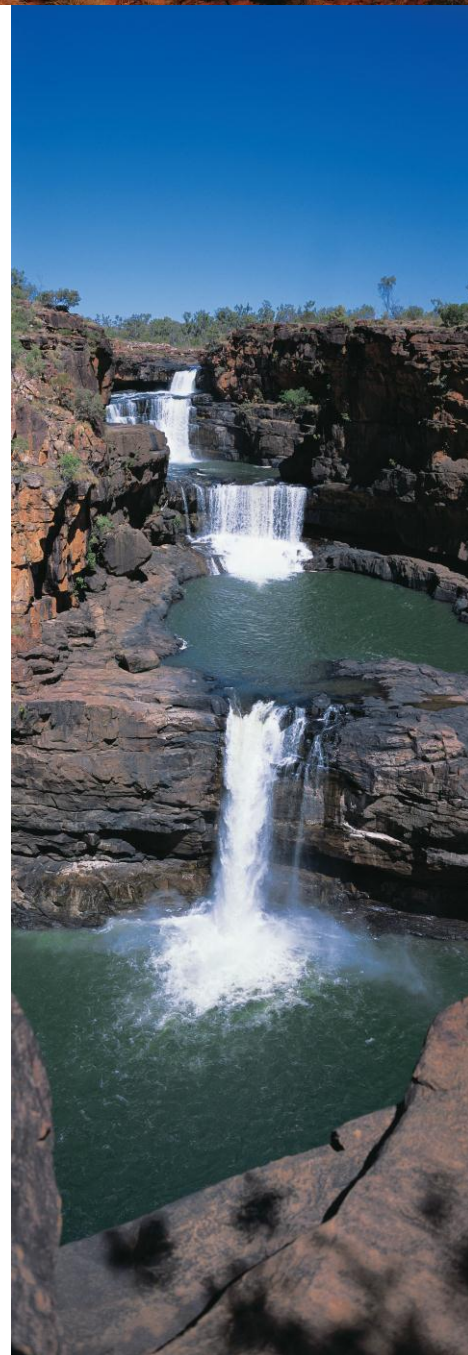

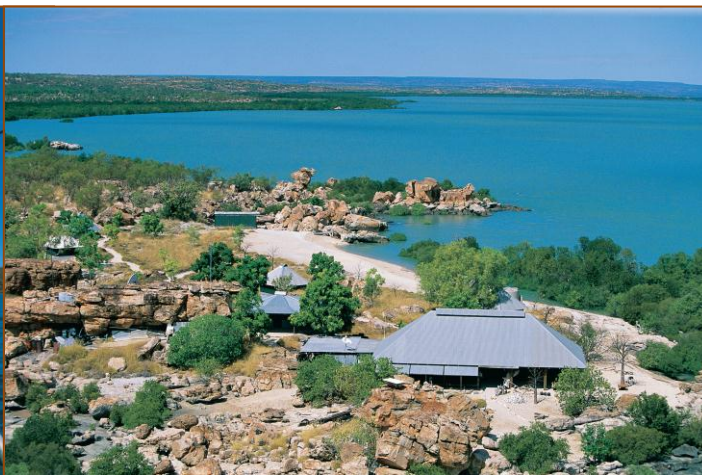

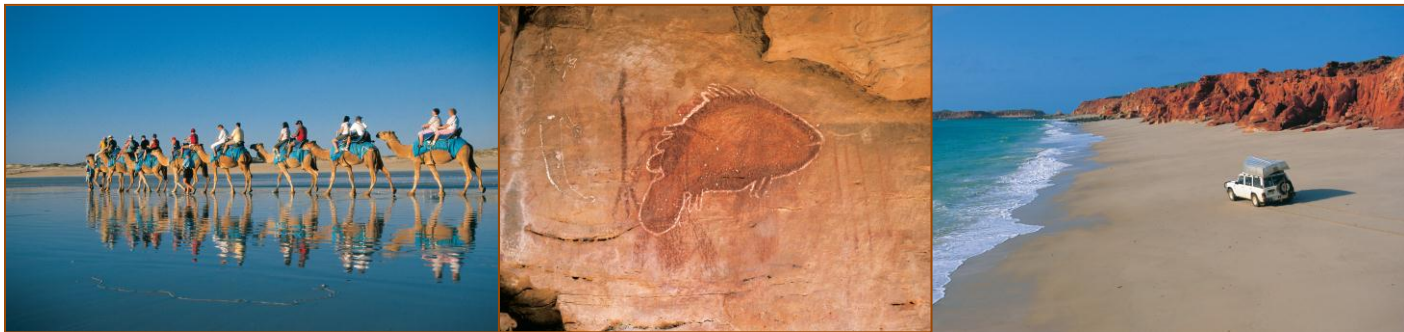

Prices are "per person" in New Zealand Dollars based on the Kimberley Land Itinerary (commencing in Kununurra 21 June 2014 and concluding in Broome 04 July 2014). Prices are for payment by internet banking, or cash, or personal or bank cheque and subject to availability at time of booking. Prices are based on current exchange rates as at 02 September 2013. Due to possible currency fluctuations and changes in service costs, prices are subject to variation at any time until full payment is received.

A natural phenomenon created by the rising of the moon reflecting off the exposed mudflats during low-tide at Roebuck Bay. Dates for 2014 are yet to be confirmed but likely to be around 13 June and 13 July.
